Studio4 is not afraid to push the envelope: starting with considerable research into materials and complex forms the students' work extensively through physical models. This is important because a model cannot hide its intentions in the way that drawings frequently do. A model also forces us to engage with materials, depth, weight and is often the only meaningful way to convey such complex and beautiful shapes. Computers help to resolve some of the geometries and with the advent of 3d printing, robotics, laser cutters and the like the studio has manifest its proposals in some extraordinary productions. A danger of this approach is that the architect works in venal isolation from the location of the proposal and even the very function of the building – but thankfully not here. Instead the Studio has tackled the themes of arrival, departure, threshold and event. Semester1 considered the Mersey Ferry terminus at Seacombe – a challenging but very rich brief with civic design implications for the wider area. Semester2 moved to the western edge of the Wirral peninsula where the brief was to design a spa on the cliff edge of Thurstaston. Designing in a semirural context demands a gentle touch but is no excuse for timidity or conservative proposals. Risks need to be taken, mistakes can be celebrated. In a school of architecture we should commend those projects that grapple with intricate geometries and attempt to form meaningful spaces within and between those exciting volumes and dramatic shapes.

Introduction

Studio 04 is focusing on emerging trends in architecture, related to novel technologies and digital design. Students are encouraged to explore innovative architectural geometries, typologies and structures. Our design method is based on analysis of site and architectural precedents, form finding experimentations focusing on physical and digital model prototypes and finally their transformation into architecture.

Semester One A Ferry Terminal for Liverpool: researching on material driven geometries

In the first semester of year 3, we have investigated the relationship between, material, structure and geometry in order to design a Ferry Terminal located in the greater Liverpool area. In particular, we have focused on the use of material systems, their construction principles, production characteristics and application, and how they condition the structural, spatial and environmental qualities of a small, free-standing building. Our site, being located between water and land, brought its own challenges and opportunities to be considered. In order to maximize student experience and future employability skills, studio4 has provided optional 3D modelling tutorials in Rhinoceros 5, in addition to an optional field trip to Venice. During our trip, we have experienced the city's special relationship with the water, as well as the world famous Venice Architecture Biennial exhibition, where we held one of our seminars open to the public. We were excited by the spontaneous interaction and positive feedback we have received by many of the visitors.

Semester Two Thermae, Bath, Spa & Well-being: architecture inspired by nature

In our second semester we have investigated the relationships between, space, typology, structure and geometry in order to design a Bath / Spa facility located in the greater Liverpool area. In particular, we have focused on structures inspired by nature in all types and scales and the way they condition the spatial, typological, contextual and environmental qualities of a middle size, free-standing building. Our site, being located by the water, brought its own challenges and opportunities to be considered. In our constant effort to maximize student experience and employability skills even further, studio4 continued to offer optional 3D modelling tutorials including Rhinoceros 5 and Grasshopper as an introduction to parametric design. In addition we have organised an optional field trip to Bath where we have visited the famous Thermae. Alongside a guided tour through the Spa facilities, all students had the opportunity to experience a 2 hour treatment in Britain's only natural thermal baths.





















