While its grand, leafy boulevards attest to the city's gold-rush heritage, the laneways that cut through behind have been reclaimed in recent decades as the arteries of Melbourne's hip culture, and are dominated with street art and trendy cafes serving up the latest Melbourne food craze. Trams lumber back and forth on routes radiating out like spokes from the iconic Flinders Street station, while the Yarra River flows lazily through the city, flanked by the lively South Bank, a hub for music and street performance. The high quality of living and abundance of cultural events and festivals has earned Melbourne the title of world's most liveable city for the fifth year running in 2015 by the Economist.
About RMIT	Originally a private night school, RMIT was opened to the public in 1992 and is already a world leading institution ranked 3 <sup>rd</sup> in Australia for Universities under 50 years old and 16 <sup>th</sup> in the world for art and design.
