The school of architecture is based at the Callaghan Campus that is 7 and a half miles outside of Newcastle with the city being approximately 73 miles from Sydney.

Once a heavy industry hub, Newcastle is shifting into a creative innovation centre, offering a unique space for resourceful, transformative architectural learning and practice. The bachelors and master's courses are delivered via live projects in the city and beyond, students develop design principles that emphasise social, economic and environmental sustainability, with students given the opportunity to engage with NSW Urban Growth and local government; understand and work within the real architectural projects regionally.

During each Architecture Studio course, you students explore the core information and resources that explain the conditions of the project as site, landscape and place; the technical information required for its development, detail and resolution; together with the historical and theoretical knowledge that underpins architectural design.
