It is famous for its spectacular landscapes, isolated beaches such as Wineglass bay, highlands and rainforests which are all home to some species of plants and animals found nowhere else on earth meaning that much of its wilderness is now worthy of World Heritage Listing. It offers a rich history, world class art and culture as well as amazing food and produce. The capital city Hobart offers a blend of heritage and lifestyle with attractions such as the Saturday Salamanca Markets which offer a wide range of food, wine, art and jewellery. Hobart is also home to the Museum of Old and New Art (MONA) which includes over 300 displayed works ranging from ancient Egyptian mummies to thought provoking and controversial contemporary art.</p>
